An interesting full-page MS. note in a late XVIIIth century hand, on fly leaf suggests that this copy once belonged to Dr. William Dodd (Grand Chaplain in 1776).

A bookplate which may well have been that of Dr. Dodd has been cut out from the inside front cover.

The book evidently passed in turn to two other owners: George Chapman George of Clements Inn [Deputy G.M. Province of Cornwall] whose bookplate is pasted on verso of the half-title and again on inside front cover along with that of Mr. John Tomes Stanton.

On the title-page, on either side of the printer's ornament, is a MS. key to the eight celebrities depicted in the foreground of the engraved frontispiece. Some MS. stanzas alluding to the Royal Arch have been added at foot of the Master's and Warden's Songs, also the verse complimentary to the Ladies in the E.A.'s Song. Several blank leaves of old paper have been bound in at the end of the volume for notes; the first four being occupied by copies of official forms: Petition to the Committee of Charity; Petition for a Constitution; Copy of Dispensation to certain Brothers authorizing them to form the Lodge of the Three Grand Principles, at the Golden Lion, Market Street, Penryn, Cornwall—Warranted 21st April, 1799. Signed by George C. George, Dep. G.M. for Cornwall.
